Arigatoo	Thank you
Doomo	Thank you
Doomo arigatoo	Thank you
Doomo arigatoo gozaimasu	Thank you

**Muita huomionosoituksia:**

Doozo	Please (when giving something)
Onegai shimasu	Please (asking for a favor)
Shitsurei desu ga,...	Excuse me (when interrupting)
Sumimasen	Pardon me (e.g. after unintentional push)
Shitsurei shimasu	"I am leaving" (e. g. when leaving the meeting room before others)
-san / -sama	Use always the name of others

**Myöntäminen/ kieltäminen:**

Hai	yes
lie	no
Hai, soo desu.	Yes, that's correct.
lie, chigaimasu.	No, that's not the case.

**Kuunteleminen**

Hai....hai	ok, I see.
Soo desu ka.	Yes? Is it? Do you?

**Itsensä esittely:**

Hajimemashite	Nice to meet you (expression for <b>the first</b> meeting)
.....to mooshimasu /desu =	
Introduce your name: My name is.....	

**Yoroshiku onegaishimasu / Doozo yoroshiku /**

**Yoroshiku:** Good cooperation, please.....

**Kansalaisuuksia:**

Suweedeen-jin	a Swede
Doitsu-jin	a German
Nihon-jin	a Japanese
Chuugoku-jin	a Chinese
Kankoku-jin	a Korean

<b>Okuni wa (dochira desuka)?</b>	"Where are you from?"
<b>Igirisu-jin desuka?</b>	"Are you from U.K.?"
<b>lie, Finrando-jin desu.</b>	"No, I'm a Finn."
<b>Robaniemi kara desu.</b>	"I'm from Rovaniemi."

**Kielitaitoa kysyttäessä:****Nihongo wa dekimasen ga,...**

"I don't speak Japanese"

**Nihongo wa wakarimasen ga ...**

"I don't understand Japanese"

**Eigo dekimasen deshooaka / Eigo hanasemasuka**

"Excuse me, but do you speak English?"
